The Sailing Season

The season started off with lots of promise as the Southern Charter Spring Open Classic with invitational sailors attending, was well supported. Regrettably the ZVYC Moorings Club Championships was not supported at the levels that we would have expected, given the wonderful Moorings sponsorship prize!

Back to Basics

The interesting insight from this event was the emerging Finn class with 100% participation from all the club Finn sailors and which, with eight boats on the water, was surprisingly the most dominant class. What is noteworthy for the other classes and fellow sailors is that the Finn class community this year was well connected.

By building class sailing communities we will build an awesome sailing Club. We have promising emerging Dabchick and Laser 4.7 class communities, a growing Finn class and we need more focus on the 29er, 420, Laser radial, Laser full rig and Sonnet classes to rebuild those sailing class communities. In the years ahead we need class "Champions" to step forward and champion your classes!

Extraordinary Sailing Members

We are grateful to all our volunteers on rescue, on the bridge and in the back office, who have contributed to the successful running of our club. We say a big thank you to you all! This year I would like to single out Stefan and Stefania Falcon's continued commitment to sailing and in particular to our Optimist program, in introducing beginners to sailing with such passion and patience in what could only be described as the most difficult and trying conditions, given the low water muddy conditions at our club! A contribution always with a smile! From the committee and all our members we say a very sincere thank you for your continuing contribution to sailing and to ZVYC.

ZVYC Management Team Changes

A big thank you once again to other legends Ron and Anna Keytel for their continued commitment to ZVYC administration management. Towards the end of the season the administration structure was re-organized, with our newly appointed ZCYV Club Manager-ess, Ms Kathryn Hartley, taking more responsibility for the running of the club and its income-generating operations. While Anna takes on the role of administration assistant, Ron takes the position as sailing secretary, reporting to and supporting the Club Manager.

ZVYC Finance on Track.

Once again we can report that the Club made a small profit for the year, coming in on budget. Thank you to all those members who paid their club subscriptions.

An analysis of the club's operating finances indicates a continuing swing from club subscriptions to other trading support activities such as bar, function rentals, boat parking and boat garage rentals. The sweating of the club assets is a continuing focus of our attention as we have a valuable asset which needs to be optimized and maintained.

An analysis of our expenses indicates that the property expenses, although our biggest expense at 40%, have dropped, due to the reduction of our rates bill. Administration costs at 35% is the second biggest expense. We are satisfied that the costs are under control and that the club's funds are efficiently administered. We are running and will continue to run a tight ship.

To summarise, the increasing income from other activities, charging appropriately for the usage of the club and the controlling of the costs means that we can limit this year's increase in subscriptions and boat parking to an inflation increase of 8% on average. In addition, we encourage members to pay on a monthly basis by direct transfer.

To Vice Commodore Craig Leslie for driving the club operations, Rear Commodore Sailing Alastair Keytel for organising the sailing at ZVYC and the general committee, a very big thank you for your time and effort put into the successful running of ZVYC. Finally but not least, to Joe and Ann. Thank you for your contribution to keeping ZVYC shipshape!

The Way Forward

We have recognized that we need a renewed focus on the marketing of our successful Optimist junior sailing program. Our plan is to extend the junior sailing program to include two man dinghies. In addition, we plan to run a senior sailing program and possibly a skipper's course at the same time. We also plan to extend the Sailpro coaching program to the weekends to connect the weekday Sailpro sailors with the weekend club sailing and racing program.

Most of all we will be focusing on building class sailing communities – looking for those class champions to drive the class, the club and the sport of sailing!

We look forward to seeing you all back on the water next season!

The 2014-2015 Rowing seasons must have been one of the busiest in the history of the club. No doubt the highlight was the celebration of the club's 150th birthday, making it the oldest rowing club in the country, and to our knowledge the oldest sports club in South Africa. More about the celebrations later.

Membership:

Our membership has increased by approximately 10 members, which is a significant number in a small club. It is our challenge to offer them what they are looking for in rowing so they stay. We have added junior members, and they are active. We lost very few members, they left mainly due to moving out of the southern suburbs. We introduced a mentorship programme, where two young rowers who had come through the ranks of Grassy Park High School Rowing Club were sponsored by the committee to be full members of Alfreds. They have grabbed the opportunity with both hands and have improved immeasurably as rowers, as well as helping as coaches at Grassy Park Rowing Club. Thanks to the efforts of Tommy Brummer, Andrew Adler, Gavin Kirk and numerous others in this regard.

We have also undertaken to support Grassy Park High School Rowing Club in any way we can - one of our junior members, Pier du Plessis has put enormous time and effort in this project and needs to be recognized for this.

Due to the efforts of Brian Christie and Richard Moolenschot in conjunction with Anna Keytel, we have our most accurate membership list in years, and we have a good hold on our membership.

One of our former members, Ron Viney, passed away due to ill health during the year; we pay tribute to his efforts in the club while a member. Ron did a lot of work in establishing Grassy Park Rowing Club, and was a respected coach. He knew an enormous amount about boats and rowing, and was always available to pass this knowledge on.

Finances:

Thanks to the boost the club got with the 150 celebrations, our finances look healthier than they have been in the last 10 years at least. Brian Christie and the ZVYC committee have been instrumental in sorting out outstanding issues, and now we all know clearly where we stand. All club members pay all their dues to ZVYC, with extra money paid by rowing members to a separate account as a boat purchasing fund. This account is audited by the ZVYC auditors to keep all financial matters transparent.

Equipment:

With the increase in membership, there has been great strain on our equipment.

The team of Tommy and Brian Brummer have done their best to keep our boats in good condition; they have occasionally called on the services of Bryan Jeffes when things became too technical, but most equipment is in good condition due to general care by members. We have instituted rules so that certain boats are to be used by senior members only. Thank you to Richard Moolenschot for putting in many hours sorting out and repairing our oars; we now have oars dedicated to boats, correctly set and with labelled racks so the oars go back to their correct place after being used (we hope!)

Alfreds is in sore need of further boats, especially quads and fours; the club only has one quad and with the money collected over the season and pledges from members, we have effectively put in an order for a quad with a South African Manufacturer. This will be the first purchase of a new big boat for the club in at least 20 years!

Our clothing apparel has had a major boost with the 150 celebrations; the club had member blazers designed to the specifications based on the 100th birthday celebrations. We have new caps, rowing sweats and golf shirts and Tweet Brummer is in the process of arranging wind cheaters and long sleeve shirts.

We have also seen the painting of the inside of one of our sheds which has really spruced it up significantly, and there has also been paving added to the entrance to the rowing sheds and boat park which has improved the area. It also allows our aging membership to push our rowing trailer out of the avenue and back to its parking space that much easier, much appreciated by all!

Regattas:

Alfreds has had an outstanding season on the water! The National Champs in Pretoria last April was attended by a relatively large group of rowers who walked away with 21 gold medals! The club won the all important Mens Masters Vllls race, along with novice quads, Masters doubles in two categories and Masters sculls. This is the best haul of medals at Nationals in living memory. Richard Moolenschot and Brian Christie then represented the club at the World Masters Championship in Ballarat, Victoria, Australia and claimed gold medal in the Masters doubles race. Richard Moolenschot then teamed up with Dagmar Atkinson of Elgin Rowing Club to claim further gold in the mixed doubles. Again our first World Champions in living memory! The club has had representation at the Durban Rowing Club Head of the Bay Regatta; our traditional Melck Run; Misverstand Challenge (our first attendance); Knysna Half-way regatta; Misverstand Head of the Dam; Sacs regatta at Elgin; Western Cape Champs Elgin; Buffalo regatta, and we are sending a contingent to the Nationals at Roodeplaats, Gauteng. Alfreds has more than acquitted itself at most of these regattas, winning medals too numerous to mention in this report. The Western Cape Champs this year at Elgin was the best organized and attended champs that I can remember and our thanks to Western Cape Rowing, the umbrella body of rowing in the Western Cape under the presidency of Francois Pienaar, for their efforts, very much appreciated! Marleen Potgieter also flew the Alfreds flag in a regatta in Seattle, Washington, coming second in a sculling event.

150 Celebrations:

A huge amount of effort went into arranging a weekend of celebrations in the form of a regatta, Henley style, at the V&A Waterfront, followed by a dinner at the same venue, and then a regatta at Zeekoevlei the following day to close off ceremonies.

The regatta at the V&A Waterfront, organized by Marleen Potgieter, was truly an outstanding event; rowers from every corner of South Africa attended, and just about every rowing club in South Africa made sure they had some form of representation at the event. Trophies originally presented to rowers over 100 years ago were hauled out, repaired and polished and presented to rowers in a wonderful ceremony at the historic Waterfront. Personally this will be an unforgettable event in my rowing experience.

The dinner that evening at the Waterfront Clocktower, organized by July Moolenschot was equally outstanding; Alfreds was presented with a commemorative oar from Durban Rowing Club at the event; UCT and Stellenbosch University Rowing Club presented us with a plaque, as did various alumni. There were approximately 250 people who attended, most of them in traditional rowing club regalia or dinner suits, a truly memorable evening.

A commemorative book of high quality written and edited by Barry Gasson and July Moolenschot was published and sold, both to record the history of the club as well as to raise funds for new equipment. This book has been an outstanding success, achieving its twin aims. Those who have a copy will know what a wonderful piece of Africana it will turn out to be; those who haven't, we are down to outlast 80 copies out of a run of 500. Thanks to Barry Gasson, and Judy and Richard Moolenschot for their Trojan work in this project and to Terry Marsh, a non-rowing member of the club who has taken on the job of selling the last few copies. Terry has devoted countless hours to this thankless task and we thank him.

At the rowing dinner the club presented July Moolenschot with Honorary Life Membership of Alfred Rowing Club for her tireless efforts in the cause of the club, a very rare tribute fully deserved.

Finally I would like to thank the ZVYC committee of 2014/2015 for their efforts, it has been a privilege working with such a competent and pleasant bunch of people. Much has been achieved and I am able to report back to the rowing section that ZVYC is in extremely good hands, is shipshape and can look forward to the future with excitement and confidence.

House and Grounds Report

Work on the infrastructure this year has generally been limited to the most urgent maintenance items due to financial constraints

Members will note however that:

- New braai facilities have been built against the outer wall of the ladies' changeroom
- Work in making a new trailer park behind the Oppie racks is well under way which will increase revenue
- A paved area for rowing trailers had been laid next to the rowing shed to avoid having to park large trailers in the road.

A comprehensive list of both maintenance and improvement work has been prepared for when funds permit. These (as well as a number of other minor repairs / redecorating items) include:

- Re-locating the existing ladies' change room and re-vamping the existing to provide toilets with external access and storage space and a new training room.

- Repairing / replacing roof to existing change rooms
- Converting the print room to storage space and offices for Sailpro
- Improvements to the men's changeroom
- Replacing the roof to Alfred's 2nd shed as this is in very poor condition
- Repairs to ceiling in men's downstairs toilet in the Clubhouse

More progress has been made in removing derelict boats and trailers from the boat parking areas and this is an ongoing process. The committee intends putting in place a stricter procedure for boat parking allocation and identification which will improve the situation regarding those parking without paying. This will result in additional income to the club.

"Interlaken" continues to be occupied by tenants thus considerably contributing to club income.

Plans are under consideration to renovate the "Bene Bibi" property in order to reduce the current cost of this to the club and to generate income from it.

Finally a big thank-you for the great job that Joe and the management team are doing in keeping the clubhouse and grounds in the good condition that they are.
